The Climate Café with Rachael Burnett

Based around the Death Café model, Climate Cafés are safe, empathetic, inclusive spaces for people to come together and explore the myriad of feelings they may be having about the climate crisis. The café facilitator leads the participants through the session, ensuring everyone is given time and encouragement to share their fears, anger, despair and hopes without the expectation or pressure of having to 'solve' anything or commit to actions. Starting on Saturday 23rd September we will be holding monthly in-person cafés for up to 10 people each time (numbers are limited to ensure everyone has chance to talk and reflect). The EarthLincs Tool Library project

We have now submitted an application for a *National Lottery Awards for All England* grant and hope to hear whether we have been successful in the early autumn.

A Tool Library will:

- reduce the need for individuals to buy items of equipment
- reduce the need for householders to accumulate under-used items
- encourage the sharing of the planet's resources
- facilitate a sharing community ethos
- reduce waste; CO2 emissions and therefore our impact on 'global boiling'.

In particular; people on low incomes will be able to hire a wide range of otherwise unaffordable and safe items to carry out DIY; gardening; craft projects etc. through a membership scheme and a token fee. If we are successful in our bid, we will use the funding to kick-start the Library of Things' here at Mint Lane.

Please come to our consultation on 16th September at EarthLincs and have your say about how we organise things and what items to stock.



Second-Hand September

Oxfam is promoting this initiative this month and we are joining in with an event on 30th September where we will have items of clothing for sale and to swap. Bring along your unwanted items and take away a new (to you) garment or two!

Grant opportunity:
Community and
Environmental Projects



The Veolia Environmental Trust, which provides grant for community and environmental projects, has announced that the next funding round will open on the 31 August 2023 until the 12 noon on the 5th October 2023 (the deadline).

The Trust makes the following grants:

Community Grants: These grants are open to constituted not-for-profit organizations and local authorities. They provide funding ranging from £10,000 to £75,000, aimed at creating or improving buildings or outdoor spaces for the benefit of the community. The maximum project size eligible for funding is £350,000.

Habitat and Biodiversity Grants: Projects focused on conserving, restoring, or enhancing threatened habitats and/or protecting and increasing biodiversity can apply for grants between £10,000 and £75,000.


Environmental Improvement Grants: For landscape-scale improvement projects, such as habitat creation/management and species protection, grants exceeding £75,000 are available. More information can be found here: <https://www.veoliatrust.org/>
