International Repair Day and the 'Right to Repair and Reuse'

Saturday the 19th October was International Repair Day and, along with around 2,000 other repair events across the world, we took part at EarthLincs when we held the second of our, 'Get Stuff Fixed' events. This time we focused on small electricals and we had 3 items brought in, 2 lamps and some electronic scales. Both lamps are repairable but we will need some new parts and we do need more expertise to look at the scales. But it's a good start and hopefully more volunteer repairers will join us in the future.

The first Repair Café was held 15 years ago in Amsterdam and since then the repair movement has swept across the world. The Open Repair Alliance estimates that there are 4,000 active repair groups globally, performing 190,000 successful repairs per year. Their data shows that with the help of Volunteer Repairers, 53% of all products are fixed. This is impressive but many items can't be repaired due to spares not being available, or too expensive, and in many cases you cannot get the item apart to fix! Manufacturers could play an important role though more thoughtful product design and making affordable spare parts and instructions more readily available.

So there is great work being done but we can do so much more. In September's newsletter we featured an article on the Circular Economy and reducing our consumption, Repair and Reuse are key elements of this. But at present there is no national Repair and Reuse policy and it is left to volunteers and local authorities to come up with initiatives and projects to tackle this huge issue. Disappointingly only around half of waste facilities in the



UK have any kind of reuse stream and only around a fifth offer reuse for small electricals. It's a shockingly low statistic that desperately needs to change as half of electricals currently recycled could be reused or just need a simple repair.

That's why we urgently need legislation and national policy to prioritise Repair and Reuse. Our Government is aiming for a zero waste economy by 2050 and we now have a minister responsible for implementing the Circular Economy, Mary Creagh. There is a Repair and Reuse Declaration:

prepared by the Restart project, encouraging our government along this path. Follow the link for more information and please ask your MP to sign the declaration. Together we can make Repairing and Reusing the norm as we transform our Economic system and start to reduce our impact on the planet.

North Lincolnshire Council will not defend Wressle expansion challenge

On 18th October 2024 the council that approved plans for expansion of the Wressle oil and gas site near Scunthorpe announced that they will not defend a legal challenge which had been brought by Climate Campaigner Sandie Stratford. North Lincolnshire Council conceded that they would not defend their decision to support two new wells at Wressle. NLC had previously granted planning permission

This is a great achievement by Sandie whose challenge centred on the authority's decision to approve extra drilling, production and a new pipeline without an environmental impact assessment (EIA) or consideration of the greenhouse gas emissions from burning any oil and gas from Wressle. The council and the site operator, Egdon Resources, had argued that an EIA was unnecessary and that only emissions from site construction, operation and decommissioning must be considered.

But Ms Stratford said the council's case relied on outdated interpretation of the law. Sandie is very pleased with this result, and with Leigh Day solicitors for their support. 'It is high time the dinosaur industries finally ground to a standstill, so that reducing demand and boosting renewable, ideally locally sourced energy becomes the norm.' The existing planning permission for the expansion will now be quashed.

November Climate Action Days in Lincoln and London

As world leaders gather for the UN's annual climate negotiations at COP29, thousands of people will take to the streets worldwide for Global Days of Action.

On the 15th November the Lincs Divest Campaign group will be at County Hall in Lincoln to urge the Lincolnshire Pension Fund, administered by Lincolnshire County Council, to divest from Fossil Fuels, it currently has approx £94 million invested. Insure Our Survival focuses on the Achilles heel of the criminal fossil fuel industry setting our planet on fire: their insurers.

No insurance = no drilling for oil, gas and coal.

'Our strategy works – after a week of national street action in February, giant insurers Zurich and major underwriters Probitas announced they would stop insuring new oil and gas projects.'

After weeks of planning, Lincoln's XR group took part in the 'Insure Our Survival' campaign, joining other groups in the movement in both London and Birmingham during 28–30th October to ask insurers to stop insuring fossil fuel projects.

XR Lincoln also takes part in local activities and will be present at the Amnesty Christmas Market and the University's 'Lincoln Climate Action Festival' in November.

Extinction Rebellion (XR) is a decentralised, international and politically non-partisan movement using nonviolent direct action and civil disobedience to persuade governments to act justly on the Climate and Ecological Emergency.

COP29 – 2024 United Nations Climate Change Conference

The 2024 United Nations Climate Change Conference or Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC, more commonly known as **COP29**, will be the 29th United Nations Climate Change conference. COP29 will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan from 11 to 22 November, 2024.

Azerbaijan signed the Paris Agreement—an agreement within the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)—on April 22, 2016. It was ratified on January 9, 2017, and entered into force on February 8, 2017, roughly a month later.

In December 2023, Azerbaijan was announced as the host of this year's conference and in January 2024, Mukhtar Babayev was appointed as COP29 president and will preside over the conference. Babayev is currently serving as minister of Ecology and Natural Resources of Azerbaijan. Babayev previously worked as the SOCAR's* Vice President for ecology.

On 10th and 11th October, Azerbaijan hosted the annual Pre-COP meeting to initiate discussions ahead of COP29. The conference opened with COP29 President-designate Mukhtar Babayev, COP28 President Sultan Al Jaber, and UN Deputy Secretary-General Amina Jain Mohammad, and was themed 'Strengthening Ambitions and Ensuring Action'. Among the priorities were setting a new climate finance goal to replace the former \$100 billion target, fully activating the Loss and Damage fund, and supporting vulnerable communities. Discussions also included updated Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) from countries and finalizing guidelines for carbon markets under Article 6. Leaders emphasized the need to cap global warming at 1.5°C, as current data from the UN Environment Programme suggests that existing climate pledges may allow for a 2.9°C increase.

We hope that the world's leaders will take the threat of Climate Change seriously and take radical action, despite again being held in a major oil-producing country...
