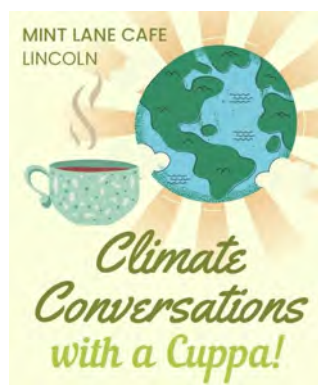

## Extinction Rebellion Lincoln and Lincoln Independent Fashion Revolution – Global Repair Day parade on Saturday 26th April

Local activists were raising awareness about the environmental impact of clothing with a parade through Lincoln on Saturday April 26.

The event: *Global Repair Day*, highlighted the 12th anniversary of the Rana Plaza disaster where a factory in Bangladesh collapsed killing 1,138 and injuring over 2,500 garment workers who were employed to produce clothing for a western market.

‘From that, a group came together called Fashion Revolution and they’re working hard at making the textile industry more transparent about what happens down the supply chain and what’s involved in our clothes,’ explained Phoebe Shaft, climate activist and event coordinator.

Fashion Revolution is the world’s largest fashion activism campaign and was founded in 2013 following the Rana Plaza disaster.

The group encourages volunteers and citizens from all backgrounds to join campaigns globally to end human and environmental exploitation in the garment industry.



The march featured a coat – The Coat of Possibilities – made up of everyday garments, worn by one of the group. The parade began at Lincoln Central Station and made its way through Lincoln with drummers and people in hazmat suits distributing leaflets, so people knew what was happening.

The hazmat suits were to highlight the toxicity involved in fabric manufacture, and the lack of adequate protection for some workers in the industry.

Volunteers had been working on the Coat of Possibilities since February, attaching jeans, sweatshirts and t-shirts to the back of a man’s coat to highlight the hidden harsh realities of people involved in growing, weaving and creating clothing for western markets, including the UK.

‘It’s easy to target the fashion industry but we all wear clothes and clothes are so important to us, they reflect our work, who we are, our culture, our religion, and where we come from. I think it’s important that we have a bit more respect for our clothes,’ added Phoebe.

The parade ended at Lincoln Cathedral with poetry readings and speakers along the way, ending with a stall during the afternoon showing examples of how to repair and rewear your clothes and show what we all can do to reduce our impact on the planet.
