



The New Mayor for Greater Lincolnshire

Dame Andrea Jenkyns has been sworn in as the first Mayor of Greater Lincolnshire. The ex-Tory MP, now representing Reform UK, was officially declared mayor at Lincoln Cathedral's Chapter House on Tuesday 6 May.

In her mayoral campaign, Andrea Jenkyns chose to align herself with denial, distraction and damaging policies. In 2023, Jenkyns joined the board of Net Zero Watch – the campaign arm of the UK's leading climate denial group. The group has previously called for an end to investment in wind and solar, urged the UK to recommit to fossil fuels and bizarrely branded carbon dioxide as a 'benefit to the planet'.

Jenkyns, who is pro-fracking and opposes electric vehicles has had the following to say about Net Zero:

'It's time we said no to net zero' and called for energy independence.' (May 2023)

Net Zero is a 'vanity project' (March 2024)

'The UK should withdraw from the Paris climate agreement.' (December 2024)

Jenkyns has said she will be meeting with a fracking company to discuss a business case to extract gas from underground in the county. She said the move would 'really save money for the Lincolnshire taxpayers'.

When in government Jenkyns voted against holding water companies to account after they dumped sewage into Lincolnshire's rivers over 30,000 times in 2023.

Since becoming Mayor, Andrea has resigned from the Board of Net Zero Watch. Furthermore in May she attended the Three-day Annual Real Estate Investor Forum, where she promoted offshore wind investment, including the Humber Freeport. An official press release from the Greater Lincolnshire Combined County Authority described this as 'a leading offshore wind and renewables hub'. Both of these actions would appear to be at odds with the Reform Party's anti Climate Action stance. In July there is a meeting of the Greater Lincolnshire Transport Board. She has pledged to improve connectivity in the county so we look forward to hearing plans to improve bus and rail services in the county.

We will see what happens next...

'We're Watching You'

XR Lincoln co-ordinated a peaceful demonstration outside County Hall on 23rd May to 'welcome' Reform Councillors to the first Full Council Meeting following the local elections on 1st May. Reform now has control of Lincolnshire County Council, and the climate activists are concerned that the Council's commitment to net zero will be jeopardised by Reform's stance on climate change. XR spokesperson, Rosemary Robinson, explained:

'Reform are funded by oil and gas lobbyists to scrap climate policies – they are putting fossil fuel profits before our safety and your future. They are pro-fracking, anti-solar farms and anti-onshore wind farms – yet Lincolnshire is the County most at risk from rising sea levels and flooding. We'll be keeping a close watch on their policy decisions.'

Support the campaign to save Lincolnshire Wolds National Landscape from oil drilling

SOS Biscathorpe is a group of local volunteers who are campaigning to prevent oil drilling going ahead in the Lincolnshire Wolds National Landscape (previous designation: Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty) which is home to a precious chalk stream; there are only 200 of these fragile ecosystems in the world.

Lincolnshire County Council's decision to refuse permission for oil drilling was overturned by the Planning Inspector in 2023. However, thanks to generous supporters, SOS Biscathorpe were able to fund a brilliant legal team to challenge the Inspector's decision at the High Court, and won!

Unfortunately, it's not over. The planning application will now be 're-determined' on Appeal by another Inspector.


Let's Grow Together
